INVITATION

1. Practically-speaking, why should new covenant believers study the writings of the old covenant?

RECOLLECTION

2. What stood out to you as you listened to the sermon Sunday morning? Was there anything said on which you require further clarity?

Are there areas in which you would like to see change in your own walk with the Lord? How can your Grace Group hold you accountable?

OBSERVATION

3. Jesus is referred to in 1 Corinthians 10 as “the Rock.” As the song goes, the man who builds his house upon the Rock will stand firm. Practically, what does it look like for us to follow that advice and build our lives upon the Rock?

APPLICATION

4. It’s all-too-easy to look at days gone by and feel that they had it easier to fight temptation, because of signs and wonders. Or we look at bygone days and feel like we have moved beyond their weaknesses and temptations. Why, according to this passage, should we be both wary and assured as we live obediently right where God has placed us?

5. Would it be fair and true to Scripture to say that all of history—from the fall to the cross—was leading to the church? In other words, what is the solidarity between the church and the nation of Israel (cf. Romans 3)?

6. What is the difference between spiritual presumption and a strong, robust faith in the promises of God?

7. What is the significance of Christ’s presence with the old covenant people of Israel?
